Plans and Partnerships

Trinity Christian School's new Superintendent Mr. Charlie Atwood is wasting no time in his new role. As he starts his twelfth year in Christian school administration, Mr. Atwood is applying his experience of serving on ACSI accreditation committees and facilitating Christian school professional development programs to his new role at TCS. When asked, he

shared his vision for Trinity Christian School.

"My focus is always three-pronged: Spiritual Excellence, Academic Excellence, and Flourishing School Culture," he explained. "While those are focus areas, they are meaningless without goals to improve those areas, and goals are meaningless without a plan."

To that end, Mr. Atwood said his team is working on a strategic school improvement plan that includes earning ACSI Accreditation in the Spring of 2026 and a research-based overhaul of the curriculum to build a more cohesive vertical (within a grade level) and horizontal (grade-to-grade) alignment of curriculum.

Here are a few of the partnerships and plans the school's administrative team has implemented or initiated so far this year.

Academic Highlights

We started the school year with the distinction of receiving Gold for the 2024 "Best in Mountaineer Country" for Private Schools by Hope Gas. It was an honor to be named and provides extra incentive for us to live up to the title and fulfill our mission for the glory of God! Here are a few of the highlights from the first quarter.

- Senior Ethan Tomlinson was named a semifinalist for the 2025 National Merit Scholarship program!
- Our Advanced Placement students' success resulted in the school receiving a Silver Level of Distinction on the AP School Honor Roll.
- Four of our high school students attended the Chick-Fil-A Leader Academy to learn how they can effectively impact their communities through proven leadership principles.
- Our digital photography students gained real-life experience by providing school pictures for students and staff. The students designed the set up of the classroom for the best traffic flow, tracked students' attendance and payments, and helped pose the student before taking their picture.
- Our new school van has been branded and in operation for field trips and athletic contests. The purchase of the van was made possible by a gift from the Richard G. & Barbara A. Snyder General Charitable Fund through the Armstrong County Community Foundation.
- Novelis, Inc. gave the school \$8,000 in STEM supplies for various grade levels including elementary math manipulatives, secondary lab supplies, and a science bowl buzzer system. Our middle school science bowl team is practicing for upcoming competitions now.

Athletic Highlights

Our students had a great time together and accomplished a lot this fall sports season; now the post-season honors are coming in. We'll start off our highlights with a few students who were honored over the summer.

- Recent graduates Carmelo Kniska and Ben Lohmann were named Scholar All-Americans for soccer, and Jillian Benn was named an All-Academic honoree for lacrosse. Jillian, a TCS senior, plays lacrosse for University High since Trinity doesn't have a team.
- Miles Steptoe made All-State for cross country with an 8th place finish. Miles is the first boy in school history to make the
 top 10 at States! Both girls and boys teams qualified for the State meet where the boys team placed 6th—the highest in
 school history.
- The soccer team won the Sectional Championship and has begun accruing post season honors. Jakub Galik and Parker Hopkins were named 1st Team OVAC All-Conference. Coach Dan Lohmann was named Regional Coach of the Year and is a finalist for the State Coach of the Year. Additionally, Parker Hopkins is a finalist for the State Goalkeeper of the Year. The winners will be announced at the All-State banquet in a couple of weeks. Congratulations to all!
- The volleyball team ended its season as Sectional Champs! The team had a great season and made good memories together.
- After the football team had to fold due to injuries, the team played an intrasquad Red vs. White game on Homecoming. Fans and players alike raved about the event and it was great to see our football players and cheer team in action.
